



## **Outdoor Contact Sports Opt-In Form**

This form is to be used by a school located in a county designated as High Risk or Extreme Risk to notify of its intent to opt in to offer outdoor contact sports for the 2020-21 school year in accordance with the Governor’s February 10, 2021 update to [Outdoor Contact Sports Guidance](#). Once final, this form will be posted to a school or district website and a link to it will then be sent to ODE.

*In Lower Risk and Moderate Risk counties, practices and games for outdoor contact sports, including high school football, can resume following health and safety guidance to be issued by the Oregon Health Authority.*

*In High Risk and Extreme Risk counties, where COVID-19 remains more widespread, schools and other sports organizations can opt-in to resuming outdoor full contact sports with additional protocols in place. In such counties, sports organizations must offer on-site responsive testing for symptomatic individuals and close contacts, contact information for contact tracing, and a waiver identifying health and safety risks and a commitment to isolation and quarantine if exposed to COVID-19. Schools in Extreme and High Risk counties must also have at least limited in-person instruction occurring, with the goal of achieving hybrid or full in-person instruction for students this school year. Schools must also be in compliance with state guidance for COVID-19 testing.*

### Plan Details for On-Site Testing for Symptomatic Individuals and Close Contacts

Myrtle Point School District currently has on-site responsive testing for symptomatic individuals available. We received the testing kits last week on February 11, 2020. The school district has trained the district wide school nurse, the full administrative team, and the athletic director to be able to lead the students in the testing process. Whenever any school personal see a symptomatic, or hears of a symptomatic student we will begin the process of getting the student tested. In the meantime, the student will be isolated until tested. Our testing procedure includes the following steps: get parental permission (students have already been given this form and parents have signed and returned them), contact a trained staff member to get the test from designated storage area, student will then test themselves in designated isolated area with the staff present. The results are then logged by the trained staff member and all positive tests will be called into Coos County Public Health.

On a daily basis the head coach of each sport is in charge of conducting contract tracing. We are using the Excel version of the covid monitoring form for our tracing. The head coach will log each individual present and fill out the form for each individual present. Each coach has been given a binder with tracing forms in it to make the process very clean. On game or performance days, the coach will contact trace the coaches and athletes, the athletic director will be in charge of contract tracing all other individuals at the event including officials, staff members, any spectators allowed.
